Dear Parents, Friends and Guardians,

Our Lenten journey has commenced and the students, along with their teachers have begun discussions about Jesus's journey into the desert for 40 days and 40 nights. This period was contemplative and prophetic for Jesus as he discerned his life whilst being vigorously challenged by the Devil. As Christian people, we are called to walk this journey with Jesus and to reflect on this period of the liturgical calendar as we prepare for the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter time.

In preparation of this journey, last week we hosted a Carnevale Parade and indulged in Shrove Tuesday, where the P &F graciously prepared and cooked dozens of pancakes for the children. I would like to extend a very sincere thank you to the many volunteer parents who supported us with this venture on this day. I would also like to thank Lucia Ciocca and Matthew Harrison for organising the Carnevale parade.

On Wednesday, we celebrated the beginning of our Lenten journey with a school Mass and a subsequent liturgy the following day for the year 5, 6 and 7 students, who were participating in an aquatics excursion the day before. Father Peter delivered a terrific homily to the children and encouraged then to approach Lent with three key things in mind, these included:

- 1. **Almsgiving** assisting someone in some way
- 2. Prayer- giving thanks to God and praying for purposeful intentions daily
- 3. Fasting giving something up that you like!

This is a significant time in the life of the church and the children will now immerse themselves in a series of activities to support Caritas Australia and Project Compassion. These activities will culminate in our annual Caritas Carnival, which is always a huge highlight during Holy Week/Easter.





SRC (Student Representative Council) – it is my pleasure to announce the SRC representatives who have been voted in by their peers for semester 1 2018. This is a privileged position and testament of the emerging leadership qualities and characteristics already exhibited by these students. RELIGIOUS IDENTITY & MISSION NEWS

Dear Families,

Last week we commenced our Lenten journey by receiving the ashes at our Ash Wednesday Mass. Thank you to our parish priest Fr Peter, the parishioners, and our families who joined us. A special thank you also to the teachers and students who supported our parish Mass in the offertory procession, as a reader, candle holder, PowerPoint operator or member of the choir.

Season of Lent (Liturgical Colour: Purple-meaning a time of preparation)

Lent lasts for 40 days (not including Sundays) and leads us to the Easter Triduum (three days of prayer that precede the celebration of Easter). These three days begin with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Stations of the Cross service on Good Friday that recalls the passion and death of Jesus Christ, and finally, the Easter Vigil which represents the faithful awaiting Christ's Resurrection (Saturday evening). Easter Sunday celebrates Christ's Resurrection, marks the end of the triduum and the beginning of the Season of Easter.



For the students and staff at Tenison Woods, we also see Lent as a journeying time of reflection and contemplation; we ask ourselves questions like...Have we found time for prayer today? How can we help others? What can I 'take up' to make our world a more just place for all?

Pope Francis shared these thoughts about fasting by 'taking up' during Lent

- Fast from hurtful words and say kind words.
- Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.
- Fast from anger and be filled with patience.
- Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- Fast from worries and have trust in God.
- Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.
- Fast from pressures and be prayerful.
- Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.
- Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others
- Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
- Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

2018 Caritas Just Leadership Day – For A Just Future

On Friday 16th February Paula Burns and Anastasia Stamatopoulos. accompanied twelve representatives from our Year 6/7 class to a Caritas Just Leadership Day at the Cathedral Hall in Wakefield Street. Michaela, Ellie, Isaak, Josh, Jacob and James from Year 6 and George, Lucas, Grace, Keira and Isabella in Year 7 were chosen to represent the school. At the Caritas Just Leadership Day these students were divided up with student leaders from other Catholic primary schools to learn about people living in poverty around the world and to engage in a dialogue about how they as young leaders could potentially respond and advocate For A Just Future within their own school communities.





We look forward to their leadership over the coming weeks as each class prepares for the Caritas Carnival.

Caritas Carnival 2018

All classes have been working on Lenten themes as part of their Religious Education curriculum, with a particular focus on the theme for the Caritas' Project Compassion appeal – For A Just Future!



Caritas Australia's annual Lenten fundraising and awareness-raising appeal, Project Compassion is an ongoing demonstration of faith, love and generosity of Catholic communities and thousands of Australians coming together in solidarity with the world's poor to address poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity.

All students at Tenison Woods were given a Project Compassion box at Monday's Assembly to take home. Project Compassion is Caritas Australia's Lenten campaign. It is the Catholic Churches biggest fundraiser for global aid and development. I ask that the box is placed in your home and filled with any spare coins.



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The students will be invited to return their Project Compassion Box to school on Wednesday 28th March for our CARITAS CARNIVAL.

Every year the students at Tenison Woods look forward to the Caritas Carnival; it is an afternoon of raising awareness and raising funds. There will be 7 stalls (each one linked to a Project Compassion story and coordinated by one or two of our twelve leaders with each class).

The students will spend the money they have collected in their Project Compassion boxes on the stalls. Each stall is \$1. If the students have \$4, they can try 4 stalls, if they bring \$7, they can try all 7 stalls etc.

A community flyer will come home in Week 5 and a list of the stalls will be printed in the coming weeks. This is a fun afternoon and all families and younger sibling are welcome to join in.

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VISIBLE WELL BEING AT TWCS

The beginning of the school year has seen all classes focussing on visible wellbeing activities and displays. When you move around the classrooms it is clear from what you see and hear that student wellbeing is of the upmost importance here at TWCS. Below are some examples of the different displays and activities the classes have been involved in so far, this year.



In R/1K the students have been exploring their own personal emotions as a way of becoming more self-aware by using their emotions wall.



In R/1G the students have been learning about how they can use a Growth Mindset and track where they are in relation to a goal.



In R/1N the students have been exploring the Character Strengths of Kindness and Teamwork. They have been using the Character Strength badges as a way to spot others using these strengths.

In Year 3/4S the students have been exploring how that can be selfaware by knowing how they are feeling and what they can do to selfregulate.

In Year 2S the students have been exploring the character strength of kindness. The students expressed how they can use this character strength in their everyday lives.



A new initiative this year is the introduction of the Learning to Flourish book. This book will include a selection of positive education activities and reflections from throughout the year and the students will have this book for the duration of their schooling at TWCS. Above are a selection of the covers of the Year 4/5T students.

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In Year 6/7P the students have been engaged in a variety of different journaling activities as a way of reflecting on their emotions and enabling them to be more self-aware.



In Italian, the students have been exploring their emotions at the beginning of each lesson which the question 'Come Stai?' (How are you?). This allows the students to build their Italian vocabulary in relation to their emotions.
