Our representation of Acknowledgment of Country

We emphasise the Boomerang because it symbolises the enduring strength of Aboriginal people and culture and the importance of 'returning'.

For non-Aboriginal people it's about 'returning' the country through acknowledgement and the importance of sharing the truth about Aboriginal history, culture and heritage. 'Returning' to country with Aboriginal people.

For Aboriginal people, returning to country is about going home to learn about culture, to reconnect and reaffirm your place of belonging. The hands inside the boomerang symbolise belonging, an acknowledgment for space of belonging for Aboriginal people.

Our country, Kokatha, we can't practice dot painting, we do landscapes. The landscape you see is our country - trees, animals; kangaroos, snakes, lizards, and our warriors/ancestors who empower us.

The people represent a community/family and togetherness. This is what being Aboriginal is all about.

Where are we from?

Founded by the Sisters of St Joseph in 1933, St Joseph's School Richmond amalgamated with Kilmara School in 1997 and became Tenison Woods Catholic School.

We are named after Father Julian Tenison Woods, a Priest who worked in the South-East of South Australia with Saint Mary of the Cross Mackillop. Together they established the Sisters of St Joseph and set about making Catholic Education in South Australia an option for all children. Their compassion and work with underprivileged and those members of society on the edges is what inspires our community.

We are guided by "In omnibus caritas" - In all things Love.

What guides us?

We follow a strong tradition of Josephite education, but also the footsteps of our founder. These traditions are present in our school today and drive the way we develop our students to be stewards of their world, and their environment.
