Successful programs

At Tenison Woods we have two very successful programs running for children transitioning to our school. The first is our Little Wonders Program. This program has been developed to support those children starting in Reception at TWCS. It is an opportunity for children to become familiar with the school, the sights, the sounds, the movement before they start as Receptions.

This term we have 17 Little Wonders who started their transition last week as they get ready to become big receptions next term in our Mid-Year Intake. A special thank you to Mrs Valleena Machado for being the Little Wonders teacher and their teacher for Terms 3 and 4. I would also like to thank Mrs Brooke Flatman and Claire Little in supporting the development of the program.

The other program that not only helps children transition to our school, but also a fantastic opportunity for families to connect with the school and each other is the very successful Playgroup program. This program is new for TWCS this year and is superbly coordinated by two wonderful parents, educators and human beings – Toni Hall and Shannon Hornhardt. Both parents are trained early years educators and are volunteering their time and energy to set up our weekly Playgroup. The success of this program has meant that there are upwards of 23 children and their families participating in Playgroup each Thursday morning.

Mid-Year Reports

This year, all Catholic Education SA schools are using a different reporting software to create our Mid-Year and End of Year Student Reports. This year's report will look a little different to that of last year. We are intending of having all Student Reports emailed to families by the end of Week 10 (July 7th).

All students will receive a report that identifies their learning achievement against the Australian Curriculum in all learning areas. It will also include grades for the Living, Learning, Leading Capabilities and a general comment. The report will be approximately 3 pages in length.

To support all families in understanding how your child is progressing in their learning and wellbeing, we will be offering Parent/Teacher Interviews in Week 3 next term. This will be an opportunity for teachers to elaborate on the Mid-Year Report grades.

In Week 4 next term, we will also be holding our Mid-Year PPL Meetings for those children currently accessing a Personalised Plan for Learning. More information will be sent out at the start of next term regarding these opportunities.

Things to come

Over the coming weeks, I am hopeful to be able to communicate a few exciting things to the wider community.

- Our Strategic Plan is in the final stages of printing and each family will be provided a copy. This plan will help guide our work over the coming years. Thank you to those parents, children and staff who were involved in the creation of the strategy.
- We are currently working with Brown Falconer Architects and Catholic Education building consultants to develop a new long-term

Masterplan to identify our building needs into the future. I am hoping this will be made available to the wider community some time next term.

- The School Board finalised the updated School Uniform Policy. A message will go out to families with the key information included.

Tips for supporting your child to read at home


It is critical that your child does not guess at random or use the pictures to figure out unknown words. The emphasis should be on the letters and sounds, as well as the process of blending them to read the word.


Some important features when assisting with the reading process:


- 1. Use a tracking finger to hold the position of reading and have your child slide it along as they read.
- 2. If an error is made, ask your child to try decoding the word again.
- 3. Re-read the complete sentence to assist with fluency and understanding.

Some children take a little longer to develop reading automaticity. The process of sounding out words may appear to be time-consuming, but it is necessary. It takes time and effort to learn to read! Repeated practice is the key!

This was a big moment for them and their families as they take this next step in their personal faith journeys. They will continue this journey next term as they celebrate their Confirmation and First Communion. If this is something your child is interested in undertaking in the future, keep an eye out towards the end of the year for information about joining the program in 2024.

Wellbeing Day this term took on the focus of Reconciliation Week and the students were involved in rotations where they were exposed to a range of different elements of Aboriginal culture. With the theme being "Be a Voice for Generations," our liturgy focused on Love for one another, and acceptance of all. 

Aerobics


This is the first year of aerobics being offered as an extra-curricular sport at TWCS and The Tenison Tigers Aerobics team have

Tenison Woods Catholic School Wellbeing Approach

At Tenison Woods Catholic School we are working towards becoming a Positive Education School. All of our staff have been involved in training in Positive Education and we have a consistent language with our staff, students and community around Wellbeing and mental health. At the heart of Positive Education is 'engaging wholeheartedly with pro-active practices which strengthen our wellbeing'. Positive Education is based around Martin Seligman's Positive Psychology and applies the acronym PERMAH in our teaching, learning and life. Along with this we teach the students about the VIA 24 character strengths. Character Strengths are the positive parts of your personality that impact how you think, feel and behave. Scientists have identified 24 character strengths that you have the capacity to express. (VIA Institute on Character). Further information can be found at the below website: www.viacharacter.org

At Tenison Woods we are extremely fortunate to have across our school Wellbeing at 3 working levels.

Tier 1 - whole school/community approach

Tier 2 - small group approach

Tier 3 - 1:1 approach

Tier 1

This year we have continued with the social and emotional learning program Grow Your Mind. In consultation with our staff a Grow Your Mind scope and sequence for our school has been developed. This supports the classes in their learning and implementation of the program. If you get the opportunity to pop in to your child's classroom or converse with your child about the Grow Your Mind program

you will see and hear evidence of this program in practice.

Tier 2

This term our Tier 2 approach has taken on two new programs. These programs are orienteering and cooking. These programs have been written by our highly motivated and qualified ESO's Ethan and Monique with the support of Courtney and Claire. These programs see the children engaging in new activities in a small group of 4-6 students. Students' complete tasks and learn about working in a group, building relationships and connections. The programs have been extremely successful, and students and families are seeing the benefits of this opportunity for the children to participate in.

Tier 3

Through the Partner's in Practice initiative our school is involved in, we are fortunate enough to have access to 2 qualified allied health workers. Gaby, who has a degree in Psychology and Karlee a Developmental Educator and teacher work with individual students supporting them in their social and emotional learning.

In week 6, the four Partners in Practice schools along with 13 other schools (160 Educators altogether) engaged in a Professional Development entitled "Wellbeing for All- All the time". This professional development was facilitated by David Bott, from the Wellbeing Distillery, a highly recognised professional organisation that specialises in the science of wellbeing and implementation of Wellbeing in Education. The day was engaging, thought provoking and at times challenging. It was a day full of energy, learning and appreciation for our educators and all they do for our schools. This learning can be applied to our own lives and to support our children within our school.

I am here at TWCS on a part-time basis but my door is always open to support your child and your family as we navigate the remainder of the year together. Your first port of call obviously in terms of your child's Well-being is the classroom teacher, but please also know that if you are in need of further support, feel free to email me or come and see me on my day at school.
