Light it Red for Dyslexia - National Dyslexia Awareness Month

Dyslexia is a way the brain processes language in the written form. Whilst some see it as a learning difficulty, I believe that it is a brain that does things a little bit differently. I have long been a strong advocate for practices and support networks that provide the support that children and their families need to better understand the dyslexic brain. Code Read Network is an organisation dedicated to ensure the necessary supports are available to all. Since 2015, *Light it Red for Dyslexia* has been a national initiative designed to bring awareness to dyslexia and challenges that can be faced when others don't fully understand the learning process. What is a Plenary Council?

A Plenary Council is the highest formal gathering of all local churches in a country. The last Plenary Council in Australia took place in 1937.

Why are we having it?

There are many reasons for having a Plenary Council: Pope Francis has invited the local Church to dialogue; the contemporary society of Australia has changed significantly; and the Royal Commission into Institutional Response to Child Sexual Abuse has been a significant and influential event that requires deep consideration and response.

Through her guidance, staff have become more confident using learning intentions, success criteria, timely and effective feedback and solo taxonomy in their classrooms.

The session held on Tuesday enabled our new principal Ben Catalano to hear about all of the impressive work behind the scenes that has gone into creating a school that lives and breathes Visible Learning. As Impact Coaches, Sarah and I were able to reflect on the school's progress and identify what has worked well and what have been the challenges. We were also able to establish goals moving forward and determine how we will maintain our excellent standard of teaching practise in the years to come.

The session held on Wednesday provided the opportunity for Sarah and I to continue strengthening our coaching skills. By providing quality coaching for the staff at TWCS, we ensure positive relationships are maintained, high expectations for all teaching staff are monitored and students are involved in their learning and progress. We pride ourselves in mentoring and upskilling staff and supporting them in being dynamic, reflective and passionate educators who strive to provide the best for all students.

Our staff meeting on Wednesday evening provided a rich opportunity for all teaching staff to share and celebrate their Visible Learning journey. Teachers who have been involved in the whole 3 years with Corwin, along with those who joined TWCS more recently all shared their experiences and vision for the future of our school. Sarah and I incorporated a number of effective protocols that Lyn has taught us along the way and we concluded by listing our agreed practises moving forward.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Lyn and Sarah for welcoming me into your team for the final year of Visible Learning as an Impact Coach at TWCS. I have absolutely loved seeing how involved the students are in their learning and believe they will continue to flourish in the years to come. I have no doubt that the incredible work that has gone into establishing quality teaching practises will still be embedded and visible when I return to teaching in 2023 at TWCS.












Reception Gold Class News



Our final term of Reception is off to a great start! We have very excitedly welcomed our pre-service teacher Miss Wu to our classroom for her 5 week teaching placement. We have been exploring subtraction in our Maths lessons. We have been learning how to subtract

numbers using number sentences, number lines and worded problems. In our Digital Technologies lessons with Kim, we have been learning about positional language using Beebots. Using the story Rosie's Walk, we coded the Beebots to move to each place Rosie went. Using the iPads on Seesaw, we created our own code. For most of us, this was brand new learning. Using our growth mindset and the Character Strength of Perseverance, we met the success criteria "I can create a code to show direction." In Science we have been exploring "How Things Move." Using a Venn Diagram and our Learner Qualities of Think and Connect, we sorted our toys into the categories, push, pull or push and pull. We are looking forward to continuing our learning this term before we make the big move to Year 1.

James - I have learnt that toy cars can push and pull.

Sophie - I have learnt that we can push and pull different things.

Aarohi - I love learning about how to subtract numbers.

Maggie - I have learnt how to take away.

Angela - I have learnt how to write a recount.

Archie - I have learnt how to subtract numbers.

Benjamin - I have learnt how things push and pull.

to the saying "sunny disposition" and that being outdoors in the sun helps improve our mental health, from an increase in positivity in moods, reduction in stress, improved sleep patterns and exposure to vitamin D.

Term 4 brings with it the summer months and throughout the term teachers often take the time to get outdoors and explore and expose the students to time in the sun. Our Well-Being day held on the last day of Term 4 was a great success. Our theme – 'Test your limits' challenged our students in many ways - in their physical skills, collaboration skills and thinking skills.

Students participated in guided mediation activities, games and puzzles. A disco was run by none other than D.J Signora, which included a limbo competition and cartwheel competition – a few staff also eagerly participated in this event! Finally 'Active Education' ran a number of challenging outdoor activities, including some 'survival games'. The best news from this day was the feedback received from the Active Education Instructors. They stated that they were very impressed with the students behaviour and engagement in the activities. The instructors were particular impressed with the relationships our students had with each other. From their connection in friendship groups to the support they gave each other across the year levels. It was welcomed, positive feedback for our students and school community. I congratulate you and your children.

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
