

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

# Religious Identity and Mission



#### Staff Reflection Day Term 3

On the last day of Term 3, Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September which was a Pupil Free day for our students, our Staff Reflection Day was held. Our Reflection Day journey this year began when Sister Mary-Ann Casanova, a Josephite sister led us in getting to know more about our school's namesake Father Tenison Woods as we explored his personality through her sharing of narratives based on his letters, photos and books. She spoke about the great importance Father Tenison Woods placed on mission and outreach. We were very fortunate to have spent time with Sister MaryAnn and have her share her knowledge with us. She is somewhat of an expert on Father Julian Tenison Woods, having recently completed a PhD dissertation on him.

As a collective staff, we then followed in the footsteps of Father Julian Tenison Woods by 'putting mission into action' when we spent

the day at Orana, Ridleyton. Orana creates opportunities for people with disabilities to live the life of their choice through a range of employment, housing and short-term accommodation, skills development programs and daily support. They aim to provide people with disability the chance to live and work as part of their community as independently as possible.

Our staff worked alongside Orana's clients and staff, volunteering our time to transform their front garden into a vibrant space of beauty and tranquillity. This highlighted the idea that community spirit shines brightest when people come together to achieve a common goal. Together we planted new greenery, arranged garden beds, adorned pots with mosaics, and ensured that the space was both beautiful and accessible to all. A highlight of the space is a stunning *Tree of Life* mural painted with handprints of all involved, symbolising growth, connection, and the nurturing spirit that the garden and the community embody.

However, this was more than just a landscaping project; it was a story of community, collaboration, and the enduring impact of shared values. The garden is intended to be a space where Orana's clients can engage with nature and find peace in their daily lives. It stands as a vibrant, living symbol of collaboration, where every plant is a reminder of the natural environment that Father Tenison Woods loved spending time in. Gardens and green spaces offer a tranquil environment where people can connect with nature and enjoy the therapeutic benefits through the sights, sounds, and smells of being outdoors in nature.

As the garden continues to grow and flourish, it will serve as a place of beauty and reflection, enjoyed by clients, staff, and visitors alike. It is a powerful symbol representing the interconnectedness of all of God's creation and the strength of community and working together to achieve a common goal. It is a place that embodies the spirit of Orana and Tenison Woods Catholic School — both are places where everyone is welcome, and where everyone can contribute to creating a better, more inclusive community for all.

#### Whole School Masses & Liturgies

Last Friday the students in 4/5DM joined the parishioners for the 9am morning Mass to celebrate the Feast of Saint Luke. Students took part in the Mass by listening to God's word being proclaimed, joining in with the responses, and singing. There were also students who read the prayers of the Faithful, and who took part in the Gospel and Offertory processions. At the beginning of the Mass the students entered the Church reverently and sat quietly while waiting for the Entrance Procession. At the end of the Mass Father Long Hai commented on how beautifully the students did this, entering the Church in a manner than helped settle and prepare them to celebrate Mass – all too often we do not get these quiet moments to be still and be in the presence of God.

Next week, on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> November, the students in 3B and 3/4B will join the 9am parish Mass to celebrate All Saints Day. This day commemorates all the saints in heaven and is an important day in the Church's calendar. The feast day dates back to the early Church, when communities would gather and celebrate the anniversary of the martyr's death. The students in other classes will also celebrate masses and liturgies at other times throughout the term.

In Week 8, the last week of the school year, we will gather together as a whole school to celebrate our End of Year Mass on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> December at 9:15am. This will be a wonderful way to reflect on the year, give thanks for all we have experienced, and farewell leaving students and staff. Families are warmly invites to join us for this gathering.





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# TEACHING AND LEARNING

#### Light it Red for Dyslexia Awareness

On Friday, October 18th, we hosted our inaugural "Light It Red" open morning. Thank you to the families who attended to observe our inclusive classroom literacy practices. These practices incorporate the science of reading, a multi-sensory approach, structured synthetic phonics, explicit instruction, and data-informed strategies. Special thanks to our classroom teachers, Amelia and Carisa, for showcasing essential components of our methods.

Our intervention program is designed to complement our classroom instruction, providing targeted support for students who need extra assistance. Our TSD program (Teaching Students with Dyslexia) is delivered on a one-on-one basis, allowing for personalised attention and tailored instruction. Trained educators Kelly and Leticia work closely with students to address their individual learning needs and strengthen their literacy skills. During the open morning, Kelly, Leticia, and four of our students demonstrated key elements of this intervention, highlighting its effectiveness in fostering academic growth and confidence in our learners. Additionally, I appreciate Kelly, Leticia, and four of our students for demonstrating the key elements of our intervention program.

#### Keeping safe Child Protection Curriculum

Our Term 4 Keeping safe Child Protection focus is 'Protective strategies'. Throughout the term students will engage in age-appropriate lessons through the Health Curriculum to develop an understanding of this topic in particular learning strategies for keeping safe and persistence. Students explore the concepts of trust networks, problem-solving strategies, using assertive language and what persistence is and why it is important. The communication letter was sent home in February. A reminder, students in Reception with Mrs Valleena Machado, will not start the Keeping Safe Child Protection Curriculum until the start of 2025.

As we focus on Protective Strategies for our Term 4 Keeping Safe Child Protection Curriculum, I want to share some important insights from the Cyber Safety Parenting Workshop we held in June. Understanding how to manage screen time is crucial, especially considering research that highlights issues like brain hacking, sleep disturbances, and isolation.

Here are a couple of discussion points to consider with your child: What are some red flag phrases they should be aware of? For instance, questions like "Do you want to meet alone?" or "Are you home alone?" can be concerning.

Also, reflect on your own role as a parent: How are you modeling behaviour? Are you setting aside devices and fully engaging during family time?

#### ReceptionM - Mid Year 2024



Welcome back to Term 4 all the Mid-year reception students at Tenison Woods Catholic School. As they step into this exciting period of learning and exploration, they're eager to dive into a variety of engaging activities and subjects. The learners have done a great job in adjusting to the school routine as well as their classroom and school community.

In Literacy, last term we focused on Phonological Awareness Skills: Blending and Segmenting, Oral language: speaking in a sentence / sentence construction. We are also preparing for our letter formation by practicing the pre-writing patterns. This term, we will egage in Identifying the Initial Sound Awareness, Oral language: Speaking in a sentence descripton consisting of what? Colour? Parts? Along with pre-writing paterns.

In Numeracy, last term, we have been practicing writing numbers from 0-5 using the appropriate cue words and working on different


ways to substitute the number. This term, the learners will gain understanding of numbers 6-10 and learn to recognise, copy and continue repeating patterns.

In Religion, we learnt that Jesus Christ was the son of God who lived on Earth, and Jesus loved children. We learnt that The Sign of the Cross is a special prayer to God and the action symbolizes your belief in the Holy Trinity—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We made a prayer chain to prayer for all the things around us. This term, the learners will have and gain an understanding of Jesus is God's son, and his birth is celebrated at Christmas.



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
