Season of Advent

We are now in the Season of Advent, which is the first season of the new liturgical year, which this year began on Sunday 1st December. The Season of Advent is a time of joyful preparation as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

Advent invites us to slow down, think about the true meaning of Christmas, and prepare our hearts to welcome Jesus, also known as Emmanuel, which means "God-with-us."

In our Catholic tradition, the Advent Wreath is a special symbol of this season. Each candle we light remind us of hope, peace, joy, and love - the gifts Jesus brings to the world.

There are four candles on the Advent Wreath:

The first candle is purple and represents **HOPE**The second candle is purple and represents **PEACE**The third candle is pink and represents **JOY**The fourth candle is purple and represents **LOVE**

At school, we are embracing the spirit of Advent by reflecting on these four gifts and thinking about how we can share them with others. We encourage families to take a moment at home to talk about what Advent means and how you can prepare together to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas.




