It was with great pleasure that I presented this to Ella Bond. These awards are a fantastic recognition of children in our community who consistently demonstrate the Character Strength of Love of Learning and Perseverance towards each and every learning opportunity.

We have a some very exciting additions to our teaching and learning programs in 2022 that I would like to share with you. We have introduced two new positions within our teaching community. The first is a position of responsibility in Early Years Literacy. Claire Little will be working with the Leadership Team and staff to implement a Reception to Year 6 synthetic phonics teaching program that will be underpinned by Multi-Sensory Structured teaching practices that are designed to support children with dyslexia. Research has proven that this form of teaching ensures all children are catered for in their learning journey. To support this implementation, I have also appointed a Literacy Intervention specialist ESO. This role is designed to provide explicit, targeted intervention for those children who are requiring additional support in their literacy acquisition.

There will also be the addition of STEM to all classes Reception to Year 6 taught by Kim Martin. For those of you who have had your child experience a class with Kim, I am sure you understand the wonderful addition this is to our teaching program. As a part of Kim's work with the Yr 6 children, we will also be establishing the Arch D Podcast series. During Semester 1, children will be learning the specifics of developing their own podcast and radio station. Keep an ear out for that!

Christmas Message from Pope Francis

Christmas is usually a noisy party: we could use a bit of silence, to hear the voice of Love. Christmas is you, when you decide to be born again each day and let God into your soul. The Christmas pine is you, when you resist vigorous winds and difficulties of life. The Christmas decorations are you, when your virtues are colours that adorn your life. The Christmas bell is you, when you call, gather and seek to unite. You are also a Christmas light, when you illuminate with your life the path of others with kindness, patience, joy and generosity. The Christmas angels are you, when you sing to the world a message of peace, justice and love. The Christmas star is you, when you lead someone to meet the Lord. You are also the wise men, when you give the best you have no matter who. Christmas music is you when you conquer the harmony within you. The Christmas gift is you, when you are truly friend and brother or sister of every human being. The Christmas card is you, when kindness is written in your hands. The Christmas greeting is you, when you forgive and re-establish peace, even when you suffer. The Christmas dinner is you, when you sated bread and hope to the poor person, who is by your side. You are, yes, Christmas night, when humble and conscious, you receive in the silence of the night the Saviour of the world without noise or great celebrations; you are a smile of trust and tenderness, in the inner peace of a perennial Christmas that establishes the Kingdom within you. A very Merry Christmas for all those, who are Christmas.

The Christmas season is upon us. We have started making our gift lists and including family and friends on our lists. But we may also include teachers, coaches, and even service workers, as we want to give everyone a gift, showing our love and appreciation for all they do during the year. The idea of holiday gift giving — to show love and gratefulness to others who have touched our lives — is certainly parallel to the concept of stewardship.

Stewardship – returning a portion, or gift, to God in love and thankfulness – follows the very same pattern. Think of all God has done for you this year, and how this love has impacted you. The blessings are no doubt countless. These abundant gifts God bestows on us are given to us freely out of love. Now think of all the ways you respond to these bountiful blessings. How do you choose to show God your thankfulness? As we prepare for the coming of Jesus during Advent, do we remember to add this name to our list? It is Jesus' birthday we are celebrating, after all.

The very first name on the list – above our spouse, children, relatives and friends – should be God's name. As good stewards, we are called to give God our "first fruits," and not what is left over. His name should not be added to our list out of guilt, or as an afterthought. We should instead joyfully desire to place God first on our list for the same reason we want to give gifts to the others on our list — out of love and appreciation.

Stewardship allows us to tangibly give a Christmas gift to God through our time, talent and treasure. Why not spend an hour in the church adoring God, or pray a Rosary to share your time with Him? Perhaps you might bring a meal to a family going through a difficult time, or watch an infant for a young mother so she can prepare for Christmas. Providing an extra offering by way of the Christmas envelope is also a perfect way to share your treasure with God. Whatever choice you make this season, make the decision to be a good Christmas steward.
